

WILLIAMS UNIFORM COMPLAINT PROCEDURES

Notice to Parents/Guardians: COMPLAINT RIGHTS

Dear Parents/Guardians:

Education Code 35186 requires that the following notice be posted in your child's classroom:

1. **Instructional Materials:** There should be sufficient textbooks and instructional materials. For there to be sufficient textbooks and instructional materials, each student, including English learners, must have a textbook or instructional material, or both, to use in class and to take home.
2. **School Facilities:** School facilities must be clean, safe, and maintained in good repair. Good repair means that the facility is maintained in a manner that assures that it is clean, safe and functional as determined by the Office of Public School Construction.
3. **Teacher Vacancy and Misassignment:** There should be a teacher assigned to each class and not a series of substitutes or other temporary teachers. The teacher should have the proper credential and subject matter training to teach the class, including training to teach English Learners, if present.

To file a complaint regarding the above matters, complaint forms can be obtained at the principal's office, county office, or can be downloaded from the county office's or California Department of Education's website.

1. Textbooks and instructional materials:
 - A student lacks textbooks or instructional materials to use in class.
 - A student does not have access to instructional materials to use at home or after school to complete homework assignments.
 - Textbooks or instructional materials are in poor or unusable condition, have missing pages, or are unreadable due to damage.

2. Teacher vacancy or misassignment:
 - A semester begins and a certificated teacher is not assigned to teach the class.
 - A teacher lacks credentials or training to teach English learners or is assigned to teach a class with more than 20% English learners in the class.
 - A teacher is assigned to teach a class for which the teacher lacks subject matter competency.

3. Facility conditions:
 - A condition exists that poses an emergency or urgent threat to the health or safety of students or staff as defined in AR 1312.4.
