Tulare County Office of Education Announces: April is Reading Month at Child Care Educational Program Reading Events Planned Throughout Tulare County

Because pre-literacy skills are so important for preschoolers, the Tulare County Child Care Educational Program is hosting Reading Month at its centers during April. While reading and literacy are a daily part of educational activities at the centers, teachers are putting more emphasis on encouraging children to choose their favorite books to be read, create their own books and acting out stories.

Within the Tulare County Office of Education, the Child Care Program operates numerous centers throughout the county. The centers are providers of federal Head Start services, which help low-income families with preschoolers prepare for kindergarten.

“Children gain the skills which lead to the ability to read and write during the earliest years,” says Lorena Davis, acting education coordinator. “Positive early experiences with books and stories are linked to learning to read. One of the best ways to promote a positive literacy experience is to provide an atmosphere that is fun, verbal and stimulating.”
