11th Annual CyberQuest Event Saturday, November 22

WHAT: CyberQuest is a technology-based competition that provides teams of students in grades 3 - 12 the opportunity to consider complex issues, solve problems and communicate solutions. Student teams are given three weeks to prepare for the competition. On Monday, November 3, team coaches were given access to the presentation scenarios, which encourage students to use their history, science, language arts, drama, and math skills to create innovative solutions to the challenges presented. All scenarios in this year's CyberQuest share a common theme involving music. A unique scenario has been created for each of the grade levels from 3 – 8. Teams, whose presentations are judged as the best in their respective categories, are then awarded trophies and medals for superior work.
