Mt. Whitney senior wins fifth annual College Night scholarship

Mt. Whitney High School (Visalia) senior Ryan Chung is the winner of the 2010 Tulare County College Night Scholarship. He was one of 85 Tulare County seniors to apply for the award which pays \$1,000 per year for up to four years while the recipient attends college or a university.

Of the 85 students who applied, nine students were interviewed by a panel of educators. Ryan impressed the panelists with his grade point average and his extensive list of volunteer activities, including tutoring fellow students and being a GATE advisor and liaison. In addition, Ryan has been a member of Mt. Whitney's band and water polo team. He plans to attend Stanford University, University of California, Los Angeles or University of California, Santa Barbara in the fall and credits College Night with helping him make important decisions about his future. Through the information he obtained at College Night, he was able to visit numerous universities and learn about their educational programs. Ryan's career goal is to earn a Ph.D. in chemistry and become a university professor in the field.
