The Tulare County Council on Child & Youth Development will host its 11th Annual Legislative Event on Thursday, November 7, from 11:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. at Tulare County Office of Education. Registration, networking, and lunch will take place from 11:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m., followed with a presentation by Dr. Steve Roussos with Community Initiatives for Collective Impact (Ci4Ci). Dr. Roussos is a consultant for early childhood education programs throughout the San Joaquin Valley.

Founded in 2017, Ci4Ci joins researchers with community leaders to collaboratively address the priorities of communities in the San Joaquin Valley.



Among the priorities is building community support for high quality early learning and care. Dr. Roussos has been a project scientist with UC Merced since 2009. In 2015, he co-developed a new minor at the university on Community Research and Service to train students in community-engaged research. In various capacities, Dr. Roussos has contributed to regional, state, and national projects to improve early childhood education and care.

The Legislative Event was created to educate decision makers and legislators about the importance of early childhood education programs and their role in creating life-long learners, particularly in Tulare County. At the conclusion of this year's event, the council will present its annual Impact Award to a local organization that is making a positive impact in the community.

Students engaged in learning about Veterans Day through the Tulare County Museum, public invited to attend celebration November 9



The Tulare County Museum in Mooney Grove Park will hold a Veterans Day Celebration in honor of the American Legion Centennial on Saturday, November 9, from 11:00 a.m. until noon.

To prepare for the event, teachers at participating schools are conducting lessons this month addressing different aspects of Veterans Day, the American Legion, and the period following the end of World War I. The Tulare County Museum has provided additional resources, including art, poetry, documentaries, podcasts, and local veterans available for classroom presentations.

As part of the Veterans Day lessons, students will cut out a poppy and write a letter on it to an active service member or a veteran. These poppies will be displayed in the museum from Veterans Day through Memorial Day. After Memorial Day, they will be sent to active service members and veterans through the nonprofit *A Million Thanks* program.



The Veterans Day Celebration at the Tulare County Museum on November 9 will include the presentation of colors by the Central Valley Vietnam Veterans Color Guard, the sharing of the history of the American Legion and the importance of the poppy to veterans, the unveiling of the poppy display, and a performance by the Mt. Whitney High School band with patriotic and early 1900s period music.

The Tulare County Museum in Mooney Grove Park is located at 27000 S. Mooney Blvd. in Visalia. Admission to the museum and park is free during the Veterans Day Celebration, November 9. For more information about the event, contact Amy King at (559) 624-7326.
