

Tulare County Council on Child & Youth Development plans community forum

A recent needs assessment commissioned by the Tulare County Council on Child & Youth Development reported that only 23% of Tulare County's 11,500 infants and toddlers with parents at work received child care services. While the statistics for older preschool children are better, only 39% of the 16,500 children were served with child care. These and other eye-opening statistics were shared by Dr. Steve Roussos with Community Initiatives for Collective Impact at the Council's 11th Annual Legislative Event last week. Dr. Roussos was retained by the Council to work with numerous Tulare County agencies in preparing the needs assessment report.



Following Dr. Roussos' presentation, Dr. Alex Elliott, administrator for TCOE Early Childhood Education, challenged the audience to continue the conversation about the urgent, unmet need for child care in Tulare County at a Community Forum on November 19. Scheduled for 8:00 until 10:00 a.m. at the Doe Avenue Complex, the free forum is designed to help guide the Council in bringing a solution to the child care shortage. University Prep student chosen to participate in Ivy League Program

Samaria Comonfort-Lopez, a junior at University Preparatory High School (UPHS), has been chosen to represent the Migrant Education Program Region VIII in the 2020 Ivy League Project (ILP). ILP was founded by Martín Mares in 1992 to encourage economically-disadvantaged students to apply to some of America's most prestigious universities. Through ILP, nearly 300 young people have obtained degrees from Ivy League universities in the past 20 years.

As part of the Ivy League Project, Samaria, who plans to study Occupational Therapy, will have the opportunity to interact with admissions officers and alumni who have extensive admission selection experience. She will visit Harvard, Yale, Princeton, Brown, Columbia, MIT, and Penn during her spring break next year.

"I would also like to thank Sofia Cook, UPHS' English Language Learner teacher, for her support, and the Migrant Education Program for sponsoring Samaria and 19 other Tulare and Kings county students."
