

SCICON and Circle J to hold annual bird count event December 14



For 120 years, the National Audubon Society has conducted annual Christmas Bird Counts (CBCs) involving thousands of volunteers across the United States, Canada, and several other countries in the Western Hemisphere. CBCs are early-winter bird censuses conducted between December 14 and January 5 each year and led by community science organizations. The surveys are conducted within 15-mile diameter circles established by the Audubon Society. In Tulare County, two active circles exist – one at the Kaweah Oaks Preserve and one in Springville.

The SCICON outdoor education program and its Circle J-Norris Ranch field study site both fall within the Springville survey area. Employees and community members who want to participate in the CBC being held at SCICON and Circle J are encouraged to make a reservation with Nancy Bruce at circlej@ocsnet.net or by calling (559) 539-2263. The Christmas Bird Count will begin at SCICON from 8:00 a.m. until noon, followed by a count at Circle J-Norris Ranch from 1:00 until 4:30 p.m.

Dance classes offered through Theatre Company beginning in January

Farm Bureau provides grants for school gardens



Tuesday morning, the Tulare County Farm Bureau held its annual Superintendents Breakfast in partnership with TCOE. The event was hosted at the Spartan Market at Strathmore High School, which is part of the school's new Emerging Agriculture Technology (EAT) Pathway program.



Following the event, EAT Pathway teacher Matt Shearer and student leaders guided teachers and administrators on a tour of their program. Visitors were able to tour two greenhouses – one of which contained an aquaponics system which could raise fish and grow and fertilize tomato plants at the same time. Another feature of the program was a CropBox – a shipping container outfitted with an irrigation and lighting system that allows students to grow greens and herbs in a protected environment.

During the event, the Farm Bureau awarded 16 annual garden grants to schools throughout the county. The grants were given in two amounts – \$500 to new applicants and \$250 for renewing schools. In total, \$5,250 was given to elementary and middle schools through the program that has benefitted schools for more than 20 years. "The Farm Bureau's garden grant program is providing thousands of young Tulare County students a way to explore agriculture and related career options," said Tulare County Superintendent of Schools Tim Hire. "We appreciate the Porterville Unified School District and Strathmore High School for hosting the breakfast. It was rewarding to see their students excited and so knowledgeable about what they are learning in the EAT Pathway."



Applications for the Farm Bureau's School Garden Grants Program are due annually on November 1. The Farm Bureau, in partnership with College of the Sequoias, hosts two annual
