

### Registration opens tomorrow for Young People's Concerts



Since 1959, the Tulare County Office of Education and the Sequoia Symphony Orchestra have partnered to bring symphonic music to the students of Tulare County. During the annual Young People's Concerts, students are treated to a live orchestral performance, coupled with lessons in music history and concert etiquette. This year, Tulare County students have voted for their favorite symphonic pieces. Once the votes are tallied, the Sequoia Symphony will produce a "top ten classical countdown" for audiences to enjoy.

More than 7,000 students from across the area are expected to attend the concerts this year. Tulare County Young People's Concerts celebrates its 60th anniversary this year as one of the oldest and largest youth concert programs in the nation.

The Young People's Concerts are open to students in grades 3-6, with this year's concerts offered October 22 at Visalia First at 9:15 and 11:00 a.m. A second pair of concerts will be offered October 29 at the Shaffer Auditorium in Porterville at 9:30 and 11:00 a.m. Registration for the concerts will remain open from September 12 until October 1 with admission just \$3 per student. The California State Library currently provides free access to three respected research and educational databases for all of the state's K-12 school districts. These resources include Britannica, ProQuest, and TeachingBooks. The Tulare County Office of Education is one of three educational agencies in California to host a full-day training on the use of these resources.

The California Online Content Project Fall Roadshow will be a fun day of database exploration and skill-building led by key trainers from Britannica School/Escolar, TeachingBooks, and ProQuest. Attendees will return to their school sites fully prepared to share and implement these resources. Attendees are encouraged to bring their own device to interact with the databases.

Teams invited to join new Student Tech Showdown January 18

# STUDENT TECH SHOWDOWN

TCOE's Educational Resource Services has created a new technology-based competition in conjunction with its popular Tulare County Tech Rodeo, a full-day professional development event for educators. The new Student Tech Showdown will be held during the Tech Rodeo on Saturday, January 18 at the Porterville Military Academy.

The Student Tech Showdown is a competition created to integrate International Society for Technology in Education (ISTE) Standards for Students into a competition involving research and presentation skills. Through the Student Tech Showdown, students in grades 4-12 – working in teams of two or three – will have the opportunity to showcase their research, digital citizenship, collaboration, communication, and design skills through the use of technology.

Prior to the event, student teams will research this year's scenario – cyberbullying. Students are challenged to conduct research on the realities of cyberbullying, the legal consequences in and outside of the school system, and its social-emotional effects on students. At the Student Tech Showdown, teams will utilize their research to create a presentation on the spot, incorporating randomly selected apps. After a first draft of their presentation, students will have the opportunity to give and receive feedback from other teams. They then consider this feedback to refine their presentation. Educators attending the Tech Rodeo will have the opportunity to observe the students for inspiration on creating similar lessons in their classrooms. At the end of the competition, winning teams in grade categories 4-5, 6-8, and 9-12 will be given medals.
