

California Center on Teaching Careers announces spring virtual teacher recruitment fairs

JOIN THE NEXT VIRTUAL TEACHING CAREER FAIR




The California Center on Teaching Careers (the Center) is holding three statewide virtual recruitment fairs this spring – February 24, March 23, and May 26. Teachers and teacher candidates are invited to register to participate in the fairs, which simulate the look of a real recruitment fair through an online platform.

The virtual recruitment fairs allow teachers and teacher candidates worldwide to remotely meet with dozens of California education agencies that participate in the online events. Inside the virtual fair, registered attendees can conduct live chats and videoconferences about job openings at districts and county offices of education throughout the state. Attendees also have opportunities to visit with representatives from participating universities and teacher credentialing agencies.

In addition to the statewide events, the Center is facilitating four regional virtual fairs for teachers and teacher candidates in Kern County (February 5), San Bernardino City Unified School District (March 17), Monterey County (March 29), and Humboldt County (April 27).

Teachers invited to register students for annual Poetry & Prose



Teachers are invited to register their students for TCOE's 37th annual Poetry & Prose program. The event, which is open to K-8 students, will begin March 28 and continue daily through April 1. Poetry & Prose will resume the following week, April 5-7. Each day, teachers can choose from three performance times – 9:00, 10:15, or 11:30 a.m.

At the event, students present their poetry selections solo or in small groups to a judge who provides a written assessment of their performance. The event is designed to build students' appreciation for poetry and encourage them as they develop their public speaking and performance skills.

Currently, Poetry & Prose is being planned as an in-person event. Students, teachers, and family members attending the event at TCOE's Mooney Boulevard administration building, will be required to observe TCOE's COVID-19 protocols.
