New exhibition on Latino history opens Saturday



On Saturday, June 25, the Tulare County History of Farm Labor and Agriculture Museum in Mooney Grove Park will open a new seven-month exhibition entitled CAMINOS: Latino History of the Central San Joaquin Valley. The exhibition was developed by Arte Américas, the Central California center dedicated to celebrating Latinx history, arts, and culture. CAMINOS, which is ideal for high school students and adults, will be open to the public Thursdays through Mondays from 10:00 am until 4:00 pm through December 23, 2022.

CAMINOS was developed over three years and first exhibited at Arte Américas in 2019 with guidance from Madera native Alex Saragoza, Ph.D., professor emeritus of Chicanx Latinx Studies at University of California, Berkeley. The exhibition presents the history of Latinos in the Central San Joaquin Valley since 1772 to the present as the region changed from native to Spanish to Mexican to United States control. CAMINOS chronicles the development of Latin American culture in the San Joaquin Valley, and the successes, contributions, struggles, and self-advocacy of its people.

Amy King-Sunderson, curator for the Tulare County Museum, encourages high school teachers to make reservations to bring their classes to the exhibition. Students and the

public are also invited to attend free "platicas," or lectures, being held the second Sunday of each month from 1:00 until 3:00 p.m.
