

Inaugural CTE Summit set for September 11



The college and career readiness programs of the Tulare and Kings county offices of education have partnered to host the inaugural CTE Summit on September 11. K-12 and postsecondary teachers, administrators, and counselors are invited to attend to gain a better understanding of career technical education and how to create more CTE opportunities for students.

Robert A. Flores, Ph.D., a professor emeritus at Cal Poly San Luis Obispo, will be the keynote speaker. Flores teaches graduate courses for the master's program in the Agricultural Education and Communication Department. He also serves as a core faculty member for the California Agricultural Leadership Program. Flores served as a co-advisor to the Cal Poly Latinos in Agriculture and a national officer of the Minorities in Agriculture, Natural Resources and Related Sciences.

A variety of breakout sessions will feature topics that include industry engagement, apprenticeships, advisory committees, adding "spark" to your classroom, and more.

Guzman was a transitional kindergarten student at Crestwood Elementary School in Visalia last year. Teacher Raul Gonzalez had high praise for the four-year-old, saying "She has really kept me on my toes in showing that she can be the model for responsibility. She always completes her work with high quality, she always helps clean up her classroom, and she never has to be told to clean. Since the first day of school, she knows what she needs to do."

Nominations for this year's awards will be accepted through September 29 for Tulare County school programs who are exhibiting great character. Teachers, parents, and family members are encouraged to nominate Kids of Character as part of the 28th Annual CHARACTER COUNTS! Week Celebration (October 16-22). The Six Pillars of Character that students can be nominated for are:

TRUSTWORTHINESS - Being honest, telling the truth and keeping promises

RESPECT - Treating others the way you would like to be treated

RESPONSIBILITY - Doing what you are supposed to do

FAIRNESS - Playing by the rules

CARING - Being helpful, kind and generous

CITIZENSHIP - Doing your share in your family and community

Last year during CHARACTER COUNTS! Week, over 4,700 students from 156 schools in Tulare County were recognized – a spectacular demonstration of the community's continued support of the CHARACTER COUNTS! program. What started as a celebration of students modeling the Six Pillars of Character in 1996 has turned into a national character recognition model which has honored tens of thousands of Tulare County students over the past 28 years.
