College and Career Readiness welcomes two new staff members



George Rodriguez, Ed.D. and Emilia Wade have joined the College and Career Readiness (CCR) department.

Wade will serve as a College and Career engagement specialist and will assist with two of the department's newest student events – the Gas Company Challenge and the Community Design Challenge. Wade comes to CCR from Farmersville Unified School District where she served as a Career Technical Education (CTE) coordinator and secondary counselor lead. Prior to her service

in Farmersville, she was a high school counselor and the scholarship coordinator for 13 years at Orosi High School, in her hometown.

George Rodriguez has been selected as coordinator, College and Career Readiness. In this role, Rodriguez will work with the California Department of Education to assist and oversee the Golden State Pathways Program (GSPP). Earlier this year, the Tulare County Office of Education was selected as the Lead Technical Assistance Center for the GSPP, which is the state's \$500 million investment in college and career readiness.
